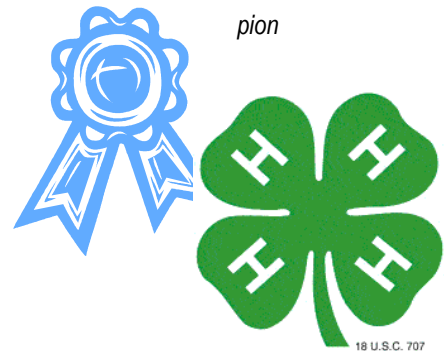

Club Highlights for 2010-2011

The past year saw the completion of many successful club projects in which members achieved worthy goals. The club opened the year by participating in the Fall Harvest Carnival, serving as operators to help run carnival games. Other fall activities included the club's fourth annual Trick or Treat for UNICEF drive.

In the spirit of the Christmas season, the club offered the following donations:

Christmas Spirit Toy Drive - A donation of \$75.00 to the Jr. Miss Committee's Christmas Spirit Toy Drive. The funds were used to purchase toys to fulfill the requests of community children.

Zion Lutheran Church - A donation of \$100.00 to Zion Lutheran Church in thanks for use of the church basement for club meetings.

KJ Senior Meal Site - A donation of \$100.00 to the Meal Site, which provides meals to the community members at an affordable cost every Wednesday and Friday.

Swimming Pool - A donation of \$100.00 to the City of Kendrick to purchase pool passes for the upcoming summer season for families of limited means.

In February the club also donated \$375.00 to help cover expenses for the i2i Presentation on substance abuse prevention that was conducted at the Juliaetta Elementary School.

Spring brought another burst of activity, as members launched the annual Aluminum Can Drive. The proceeds of the drive were matched by a grant from the Latah County Chapter of Thrivent Financial for Lutherans, generating total earnings of \$450.00 in a six week period. The drop site for cans remained open for the rest of the year, and proceeds totaling \$400.00 were donated to the City of Kendrick for support of the Memorial Swimming Pool. Other club donations supported the community newsletter, "Here's What's Happening," and the Tossed and Found Recycle and ReUse Workshops held in Kendrick and Juliaetta during March and April. The club also purchased candy to fill eggs for the Community Easter Egg Hunt. In August, the club donated \$60.00 to cover the cost of the free swim offered during the Summer Evening in the Park event.

Club members' fine performance at the Latah County Fair rounded out a very successful year for Fix Ridge 4-H, and the group looks forward to an exciting roster of activities for 2011-2012. Fix Ridge 4-H members, leadership and families are very grateful for the continuing support of the community, which makes all of the club's activities possible.

It enabled us to enrich our supply of Juliaetta archives and make an interesting Blackberry Festival display. Many enjoyed both the military uniform exhibit and Juliaetta photos at the festival. We also raffled off four items. The "Letters from the Front...Volume II" book was won by Forest Williams, the Von Zumhofe birdhouse was taken home by Mikey Chamberlain, a locally made quilt was won by Dwight Bovey, and the wood turned canister set was claimed by Duthiel Stellyes.

We will host the **Latah County Historical Society** members at our October 20th meeting. They will tour the Grange Building, which has been nominated for the National Historic Register. Funds are now being requested to replace the signs, print a Walking Tour booklet that includes pictures, an increased description of the designated historical sites and provide facts about our present community and lastly JKHF plans to provide a CD providing the option the Walking Tour as a "vehicle" tour.

Juliaetta City Council with 5 council members, Ed Pea, Kevin Cope, Dick Groseclose, Vickie Jo Witt and Mayor Jeff Lohman meet the 2nd Tuesday of each month in the Council Chambers directly behind the Juliaetta City office on Main Street. This year's election which will be held November 8, 2011 will have 3 positions up for election; the mayor and two council seats now occupied by Jeff Lohman, Dick Groseclose and Vickie Witt.

The city has a website, cityofjuliaetta.com, which has the minutes from previous meetings, ordinances and regulations for the city. It is always in the process of being updated and new regulations added.

We have just started our new fiscal year which begins on October 1st. Mary Jo Vallem, City Treasurer is preparing for the 2010-2011 audit. Becky Tefft is Juliaetta's City Clerk. They are in the office Monday- Friday from 8:00 a.m to 12:30 p.m the first two weeks of the month and Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m the last 2 weeks of the month. Frank Groseclose and Bill Fey are in charge of maintenance for the city.

The city council would like to congratulate the Juliaetta Community Improvement Association for continuing to plan and promote the Blackberry Festival and Car Show. The city would like to thank the organization for this year's shirts which were presented to the city.

One item discussed at a city council meeting was the need for riprap to be placed in the dike behind Heimgartner Baseball Field. The ball fields and park were flooded last spring by the high water. With a lot of volunteer help it was repaired but there is a chance if the same conditions arise we would have the same result. Now with the creek at a low level, it is the time to reinforce that area. Mike Quigley has donated the riprap if we can get it down from Pierce. If anyone has a truck and could help, please contact city hall or a council member. The city will help with the expense of your fuel.

The city would like to thank Polly Taylor Dennler and "her helpers" for planting and watering the flower pots on the sidewalk along Main Street this summer. It is so nice to drive through town and see beautiful flowers.

Another project that will be happening is putting the Christmas Lights and Decorations on the baseball fields and the Centennial Park in Juliaetta. We would like to make this a community project, so if you would like to help, tell a council member or call city hall.

Have you noticed the Star and Cross on the hill had been missing? The wind and weather this last year caused considerable damage. Dick Groseclose rebuilt both and they are ready to be used. 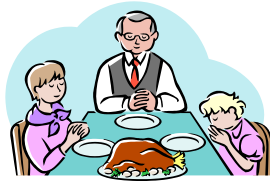

Urban Forestry News

If you have walked or ridden along the bike path through Kendrick, you may have noticed native plants beginning to take hold through the mulch which is protecting their young roots. Thanks to a grant procured by the Urban Forestry Committee, these plants are watered and cared for throughout the summer. In addition, a number of trees got pruned this summer and a hazardous limb was removed from a poplar. Other work to be completed this year includes dismantling the water trailer and winterizing the pump, transplanting an oak tree that has been encroached upon by several other trees across from the RV toilets, and planting several new trees to provide shade and more fall color.



Can you identify the trees gracing Kendrick City Park? Urban Forestry member Dave Klatt is spearheading a "City Park Tree Identification Project," with tree identification, park topography, and a plan for a waterproof frame complete. The framed identification map will be a permanent display in the kiosk. Dave will be working with a landscape architect and the project should be completed in the spring.

About 35 locust trees were sprayed this fall with SEVIN in an effort to help slow down the locust borer beetles that are attacking and will eventually kill our locust trees. These beetles are about 1 inch long, black with distinctive yellow markings. Property owners who would like more information about these insects and their effect on our city trees can call the city offices.

SOUTH LATAH HIGHWAY DISTRICT NEWS

Howard Jones was sworn in to become the new South Latah Highway District commissioner for sub district 2 by District Clerk Mary Schwenne at the October 7, 2011 meeting. He was appointed by Chairman Kevin Renfrow and Vice-Chairman Duane Roach to fill the vacancy left by Commissioner Kelly Giese whose term expired on October 1, 2011. Sub district 2 covers the area east of Genesee and includes the City of Juliaetta. Vice-Chairman Roach was sworn in July 1, 2011 after winning the May 17 election unopposed. No one ran for the seat in sub district 2 in that election.

SLHD is applying for a FEMA grant to control future flooding and repair costs near the Danielson Rd. culvert. It will be April before the grant is announced. We are also applying for a LRHIP (Local Rural Highway Investment Program) grant for help with the cost of seal coating SLHD roads.

The crew is preparing the equipment for winter and improving the roads before the snow flies. Studded snow tires can be mounted on vehicles as of October 1 and have to be removed by April 30. Drive safely this winter, especially on curves and snow-covered roads.
